Members can either spend New a few relaxed days here or proceed on to Nairobi at your own leisure.

Important Notes

- Ensure your vehicle is well serviced; a spanner day will be held before departure
- The itinerary gives details of 10 days, but members are advised to reserve up to 14 days if participating in the entire expedition.

This is because of (un)expected delays at border crossings, vehicle breakdowns, fatigue, unforeseen incidents, detours and other activities that may cause more time spent than anticipated.

- All vehicles (including trailers) must have logbooks (in your name) and 10+ colour copies, valid COMESA insurance, an international driver's license, white and red reflector stickers and KE stickers.
 - Accommodation will primarily be camping unless circumstances require that we spend in lodgings.
- All vehicles must have a minimum fuel range of 1,000kms
- Have at least 100 litres of drinking water on board at all times
- Have first aid kits and food to last a whole week for its pax
 - Two good quality spare wheels and puncture repair kits
- Essential spare parts for service, fan belts, plugs, fuel pumps, CV & UV joints, grease, silicone, engine, gearbox, CC, brake fluids, toolbox, and spare fuel pipes.
- Each vehicle should have Garmin with East & South African maps, the iOverlander and/or Sygic Apps on their devices.
- Sufficient cash for fuel, food, accommodation, Temporary Import Permits, service, park entry, and activities.
 - Spirit of resilience and patience
- It is necessary to have some 'convenience' fee money, to facilitate border crossings, particularly into Malawi, they are painfully slow at the Songwe Border.
